

Resource Development for Nonprofit Organizations (20:834:576) [3 credits]

Course Description

This course examines how nonprofit organizations develop effective resource development strategies to support their important work in our society. The course reviews the theoretical rationales and practical considerations in managing particular sources of income, including charitable donations, government support, earned income, and investment income. It also discusses best practices in designing appropriate revenue portfolios to achieve financial health and sustainability.

Learning Objectives

After completing this course, students will be able to:

- Understand the principles and practices of nonprofit resource development, including fundraising, grant writing, donor relations, and stewardship.
- Analyze diverse revenue streams available to nonprofits, such as individual donors, government and foundation grants, corporate partnerships, and earned income strategies.
- Develop effective resource development strategies tailored to the mission, goals, and capacity of nonprofit organizations.
- Evaluate the ethical and legal considerations associated with nonprofit resource development, including donor stewardship and accountability.
- Assess the impact and effectiveness of resource development initiatives on organizational sustainability and mission advancement.

Requirements

Requirements will vary by instructor and may include:

- Assigned weekly readings
- Case studies and discussions
- Quizzes and exams
- A final project where students (in groups) evaluate a specific nonprofit organization's resource development strategy
