9/11 Memorial and Wall Street Walking Tour Sunday, October 20 – 11:00 AM

One World Trade Center (also known as One WTC, 1 World Trade Center, 1 WTC, or Freedom Tower) is the main building of the rebuilt World Trade Center complex in Lower Manhattan, New York City. One WTC is the tallest building in the United States, the tallest building in the Western Hemisphere, and the sixth-tallest in the world. The supertall structure has the same name as the North Tower of the original World Trade Center, which was destroyed in the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. The new skyscraper stands on the northwest corner of the 16-acre World Trade Center. The building is bounded by West Street to the west, Vesey Street to the north, Fulton Street to the south, and Washington Street to the east. Join Marxe staff that Sunday morning in lower Manhattan and Battery Park. - free activity

A Guided Tour of the High Line: A National Model of Urban Greenspace Development and Public/Private Partnership Sunday, October 20 – 5:00 PM

A guided tour of the High Line, a once-abandoned elevated railway that was resurrected in 2009 as a mile-and-a-half long green space. The High Line is now a wildly-popular public park, a successful lesson in public-private partnerships, the epicenter of a revitalized west-side neighborhood, and a controversial symbol of urban gentrification. - free activity

DUMBO: The Creative Transformation of a NYC Tuesday, October 22 – 6:00 PM

The DUMBO (Down Under the Manhattan Bridge Overpass) neighborhood in Brooklyn has been transformed over the last two decades from a gritty, desolate warehouse district into an exciting mixed-use neighborhood that includes residential, cultural, and growing businesses along a newly built and magnificent waterfront park. On this tour, Marxe faculty, will explore DUMBO and meet the leaders. – *free activity*
